Not long after being selected to stand as your MP, I was in Beeston chatting to people. I stopped a couple walking arm in arm to ask a few questions "You should know who he is!" said the woman tugging at the mans arm "He's Sir Peter Mansfield! He invented MRI - you know what that is don't you?" I was somewhat taken back by this rather fierce, immensely proud woman who added "and I'm Jean".

Over the subsequent years, I would see Sir Peter and Lady Mansfield at various events, mainly Conservative party get togethers at Beeston Fields Golf Club near to their home. Sir Peter was a delightful and gentle man, though never shy in sharing his views with me. I became very fond of Peter and Jean. Sir Peter has been unwell for some time and my thoughts are with Jean, their children and grandchildren.

Jean Mansfield has more right than most to be so proud of her husbands achievements. Sir Peter was a remarkable physicist who was honoured with a Nobel prize for his pioneering work

on MRI at Nottingham University. The scanners are now in almost every hospital in the world and have revolutionised the detection, diagnosis and treatment of injury and disease. Sir Peter's family, his many colleagues, friends and neighbours pay tribute to his outstanding contribution to the lives of millions of people and we are all truly grateful.

"No Minister" - HS2 plans for Trowell are unacceptable

HS2 Minister Andrew Jones, visited Trowell on Thursday. I snatched 45 minutes with Andrew and officials from HS2 during his whistle stop tour of the East Midlands. I showed Andrew the impact a 60 foot high viaduct will have on the village and explained why I was opposed to it. I took the Minister to Trowell Park, the centre of Trowell and back to Beeston via Trowell Moor.

There are two important aspects to HS2's plans for the route through Trowell. The track will be on a viaduct 15 metres (45 feet) above ground level - with additional height to accommodate overhead lines of about 5 metres (15 feet). There is no doubt that the reasoning for the viaduct is valid - as residents know the land falls and rises and the viaduct appears to solve the problem. However, I have told Andrew and HS2 that their current plans for a viaduct have such a profound and adverse impact on the village that they must look at alternatives to delivering the route.

The second matter is that people living along the route in Trowell will not be compensated; again I have made my opposition clear.

Every household in Trowell will receive another letter from me in the next week with more details on the two consultations taking place. one is on the compensation, the other concerns the route. It is imperative everyone makes their views known in the two consultations which end on March 9th.

Earlier, I joined a meeting at Strelley Hall with the owners and HS2. The box - cut and cover - tunnel seems a good scheme and HS2 were clear that the route can indeed be moved further away from the village. My concern is the impact the construction will have on the village.

We are still in the early stages of planning for HS2. There will be further visits from Ministers and public meetings. At the moment it is important everyone takes

MP's vote overwhelmingly to start Brexit process

I voted with the overwhelming majority of MP's to give the Prime Minister the power to begin our withdrawal from the EU.

As you will know I believe our country's interests are best served as a member of the European Union, however I always said I would respect and honour the result. I carried out that promise, with a heavy heart, and voted for the Bill which has progressed through Parliament in the last two weeks. I spoke in the main debate last week and again this week when I backed an amendment to the Bill proposed by the Nottingham Labour MP, Chris Leslie.

Chris Leslie's amendment to the Bill sought to give Parliament a say and vote on any deal we reach with the EU, and also in the event of us failing to reach a deal.

I voted for the amendment which was opposed by the Government. I obviously thought long and hard before voting against the Government and explained much of my reasoning in my speech. It now turns out that the Prime Minister had pretty much agreed with the spirit of the amendment - that Parliament would have a vote - deal or no deal. As to why her wishes didn't reach the Minister in the debate is a mixture of cock-up and conspiracy I fear! In any event the amendment was rejected.

I very much trust the word of the Prime Minister, Theresa May. I have no doubt she understands why EU citizens living in Britain must be allowed to stay after we have left the EU. I believe the PM understands the need to settle this matter as soon as possible especially as the uncertainty has badly affected a number of EU citizens. The Home Secretary has given assurances as well. On the basis this matter will be a priority and knowing that Parliament can and no doubt will resolve it if the Government doesn't, I decided not to back an amendment to enshrine the rights of EU citizens in the Bill.

Last week I spoke in a debate on the USA President's ban on people from 7 mainly Muslim countries. President Trump has been challenged in the USA courts on the grounds it is unconstitutional. I don't know if it is or not - I do believe it is immoral, offensive and wholly unjustified.

Finally, I asked a question about the need to improve access to money for small and medium builders. Broxtowe Borough Council is trying to protect our Green Belt land by encouraging small developments on brown field sites but access to money is a problem for many builders.

School funding consultation

The Government is changing the funding formula for schools. It would mean some schools in the constituency would receive more money but others would receive less. Whilst I welcome a fairer scheme I don't think schools should receive less money! Surprisingly I have not had any representations from the Head teachers of any of our schools. I have therefore written to them all asking them to share their views with me and take part in the consultation.

Bank Road Infants will see a cut in funding which will add to the woes of Head teacher, Carole Clemens. However, Carole is particularly fed up with the unacceptable parking by parents at drop off and pick up times. Despite her best efforts a minority of parents are still parking dangerously. I've agreed to contact the local police and County Council to sort out the problem once and for all.



Attenborough crossings update

There was an excellent turnout at the public event hosted by Network Rail in Attenborough this week. Villagers and people throughout Broxtowe are against plans to close the three pedestrian crossings in the village.

Network Rail have had over 600 submissions from users of the Attenborough crossings - which is a record! A huge thank you to everyone who has contributed and campaigned to save the crossings.



I met Network Rail last Friday and we had a frank exchange of views! I explained why so many people oppose their plans and in turn they explained their concerns about safety.

We then explored alternatives to closure including a bridge with steps and ramps for bikes, wheel chairs and buggies, at the Meadow Lane crossing. Network Rail agreed to look at that proposal in detail. We even discussed the possibility of a road bridge at the Cemex site when it closes and the land becomes available. This would also provide an alternative to the current level crossing with all its many faults.

Network Rail undertook to look at the various options; they are in no doubt as to the strength of opposition to their plans! My petition stands at over 1400 signatures - please be sure to sign it too.
