There's been some good news, in these difficult economic times, for what I call Greater Nottingham and that includes Broxtowe.



I held public meetings to defend our green belt in Nuthall and Greasley. Stapleford is next - details below.

The Government has announced the A453 will be widened and improved which is a real boost, not just for drivers but also the local construction industry and for the newly created Enterprise Zone based at Boots (see below for more details of my recent meeting with Boots).

Last week Nottingham was made one of eight Core Cities, with more money and more freedom to encourage growth ie jobs; I very much hope the City Council will seize the opportunity which will in turn benefit Broxtowe.

Green Belt Campaign

Public Meeting to defend Field Farm at 2.00-4.00pm on Saturday 14th January at the Jaguar pub in Stapleford



We are still waiting for Broxtowe Borough Council's report following the so called "public consultation"; it was due to be published weeks ago. We do have some dates for the next stage with March 14th 2012 being given as the date when a full Council meeting will accept or reject the "local plan" which will set out where new homes should be built in the Borough.

I will do a separate email newsletter with more specific details and dates when I have them. I will also advise everyone of how to make your voice and views heard.

Thank you to the hundreds of people who attended public meetings in Nuthall and in Greasley which I organised with local Borough, County and Parish Councillors (I have posted reports on my web site).

There will be a **public meeting on January 14th at the Jaguar Pub in Stapleford** specifically to discuss the plans to build hundreds of homes on the green belt site known as Field Farm – I hope people from Trowell will also attend. I have met with STRAG and they are supporting the meeting and I am very grateful for the publicity they

Meanwhile there are rumours flying around about a legal challenge by the owners of the green belt land north of Toton following Broxtowe Borough Councils decision to remove the site from their "preferred sites" list. I warned at the time against celebrating too much as I feared the land was still vulnerable. I am meeting TEPS members tomorrow night to discuss the situation and keep the campaign going.

I am finding that people throughout the constituency of all and no political persuasion are increasingly concerned at the way the controlling group on Broxtowe Council has completely mishandled the entire process.

I attended the Stapleford North CAT meeting, have held three public meetings and people are genuinely cross that they have not been properly consulted and that their Council is handing over their green belt to developers.

Meeting with Boots

I had a very positive meeting with Boots about the Enterprise Zone which has been created on their site in Beeston. There is no doubt the dualling of the A453 is a major boost for the Zone.

Bramcote Hills retirement village

There is growing concern in Bramcote about moves to build a retirement village on Bramcote Hills Golf Club.

A considerable number of residents want to retain the area as a green open space whilst the owners want to make good a loss leader.

I don't have any particular views on retirement villages as there are good arguments both for and against them. However, this is important land and the views of the community who value must in turn be valued and fully represented by their local Councillors.

Evo Energy, Chilwell

The Government's decision to end the feed in tariff drew criticism from householders and solar panel installers like EvoEnergy in Chilwell. They contacted me to say they support the reduction of the tariff but not the time scale. I paid them a visit and then presented their representations to the Minister, Greg Clark. Unfortunately the previous system was about to go bust because the tariff had been set far too high and failed to take into account the falling cost of solar panels. EvoEnergy are confident they will get over the current crisis.

Stapleford home opening

I helped open ten new homes in Stapleford built by Broxtowe Borough Council and welcomed new tenants Terry and Dayle Eaton. After the opening ceremony I went on to the Mayor's Charity Christmas tea at Carnegie Hall.

Restraining top executive pay

Public Sector Pensions

It is worth remembering that the former Labour Minister, now Lord Hutton wrote a report that forms the basis of the Governments proposals and which have received his backing. The driving force for reform is the undisputed fact that we are all living longer and accordingly we all need to make greater provision for our retirement. Tax payers are paying £32 billion a year in public sector pensions so the system needs to be both fair to all workers and sustainable. I think it is worth noting people earning under £15,000 will not have to pay more into their scheme. Public sector pensions will continue to be generous schemes especially when compared to private sector schemes.

Bilborough College Parking

At last! The roads have been adopted by the County Council so residents are looking forward to the parking restriction being enforced. However, a residents parking scheme is not likely to go ahead as the recent survey failed to attract enough support. Meanwhile I have organised a meeting with the Principal and City Council officials to try to find a long term solution and have supported a pick up and drop off zone on College Way.

Moor Green

People power is sorting out the speeding and HGV use on Moor Green. I hosted a meeting with the local police, County, Borough and Parish Councillors and resident, Paul Turner. As a result the Parish Council has agreed to insure volunteers keen to take part in a Speed Watch; the police want residents to report speeding vehicles and HGV movements and they will then take action against the drivers or their employers. Meanwhile the County Council is conducting various traffic surveys. We will have a reporting back session by way of a public meeting in the New Year.

27 Bus route

I have been working with Borough and County Councillors representing Kimberley, Cossall and Awsworth to persuade Trent Barton to improve the Nc 27 bus route following the termination of the Phoenix Flyer contract. Trent Barton say there is insufficient demand to re-instate the link between Ilkeston and Phoenix Park. However, Trent Barton want to meet with us so the campaign continues to make sure we have good integrated transport in the area.
