I have arranged a meeting with the relevant Defence Minister and his officials to discuss all the issues raised by residents. It is fair to say there was concern - mounting to anger - at plans for 800 houses on the Barracks. Toton, Chilwell Meadows and its surrounding areas in Chilwell already suffer from poor infrastructure and strained services.

The way forward is for local people to come together and develop their plan for the area, working with Broxtowe Borough Council.

Creating a Neighbourhood Forum is the first stage and I am delighted so many people have signed up to join it. The first meeting of the Neighbourhood Forum is next Wednesday at 7.30pm in the Village - details in the diary.
