Hello again,

This week Councillor Stan Heptinstall MBE, completed his year as our Mayor. Stan has also retired as a Borough Councillor having served Bramcote for 24 years, though he will continue as a County Councillor. As Mayor, Stan has raised over £11,000 for his chosen charities - Cancer Research and Hope. Stan has won the respect and affection of many constituents who have known him over the years and I would like to congratulate him on an excellent year as our Mayor and pay tribute to his tireless service to the people of Bramcote. Our new Mayor is Eastwood Councillor, Susan Bagshaw and her Deputy is Chilwell's Councillor, Graham Harvey.

After contacting them, Broxtowe Borough Council have agreed to take objections to a planning application to change the use of the New White Bull at Giltbrook up to June 15th. I have written to all members of the Planning Committee urging them to refuse the application. I very much hope the developer will sell the pub to local brewery, Blue Monkey. The future of our Green Belt and an enquiry into the tram

The Conservatives won a large majority in the recent Broxtowe Borough Council elections; my congratulations to all the winners. Richard Jackson is the new Leader and I have already had discussions with him about the future of our Green Belt land.

As a result I have asked to meet him and the Chief Executive; I will also be seeking clarification and guidance from the new Secretary of State for Local Government, Greg Clark, given that Conservative Councillors and I have been elected with a clear mandate to defend Broxtowe's Green Belt.

On a separate note, Louise Ellman MP is re-standing for the Chair of the Transport Select Committee.

Louise has given me an undertaking that if re-elected she will back an inquiry by the Committee into the tram extension and the value (or otherwise) of trams to communities. I will be asking all candidates for the Chair and committee places for similar undertakings. Getting such an inquiry is a top priority of mine and I will press for it to begin after the tram is fully open.

Finally, Richard Jackson and I have agreed for a joint meeting with Greg Clark to discuss the formula by which Broxtowe is allocated money by Government. Broxtowe was one of many councils to get a cut in funding and whilst I accept the need for further cuts to public expenditure, Broxtowe has long taken the view that the current formula places it at an unfair disadvantage.



Success at Boundary Brook

After writing to the Secretary of State for DEFRA last year, the Environment Agency has agreed to install a flood gauge at Boundary Brook in Trowell.

This will issue text messages and emails to warn local people if the waters get too high and also collects data for any future work needed to protect the area from flooding. I've met local residents and know they've spent a number of years fighting off floods with sandbags and hard work. I'm very pleased that progress is finally being made!
