HS2, Toton and the future of our Green Belt



Hello again,

It is increasingly likely that Toton will be the site of the HS2 East Midlands hub given it is the only site under consideration! This is excellent news but will only be of benefit if Broxtowe Borough Council amends the previous Lab/Lib Dem administrations' "Core Strategy". You will recall this made Toton's Green Belt a site for at least 500 houses



I am writing to the City and Erewash Councils plus the Local Enterprise Partnership (D2N2) asking them to join me in urging Broxtowe to amend the Core Strategy.

I have already spoken to both the Secretary of State Greg Clark and the Housing Minister Brandon Lewis about the future of the land at Toton Sidings. I will of course keep you informed of all and any responses but you can be assured that not only will the campaign continue to defend our Green Belt but I will also oppose any suggestion other sites in Toton should accommodate all 500 plus houses if the Core Strategy is amended.

Parliament has now risen for the summer though as your MP my work continues until the last two weeks of August when I am off on holiday. I will be checking my emails though and of course the constituency office will be open and staffed.

A 453 opening

Beeston resident Jack Upton helped open the new A453 this week. Jack's son Sean, was one of the 453 servicemen and women killed during the Afghanistan conflict. After a campaign I was proud to support, the new road, which will bring considerable benefits to our part of Greater Nottingham, has been called Remembrance Way.

I have little doubt that it is just a matter of time before NET/City Council are found to be legally liable for hefty damages. I would urge them again to take immediate action to keep our cyclists safe.
