A610 - a better road and "corridor for growth"



I hosted a meeting yesterday to discuss improvements to the A610. The congestion at what I still call the Ikea roundabout, and the surrounding roads, gets worse, despite efforts by Notts County Council and local Borough Councillors. There is no simple nor cheap solution, however, there is great potential for economic development and housing along the A610 especially at Eastwood and into Derbyshire. Unlocking the potential would go hand in hand with improving the access to and from the A610 at Giltbrook and Awsworth and reducing congestion at Nuthall roundabout. We are in the early stages and I will keep you updated.

Get on with it! Kimberley Brewery site and Barton's plans update

My thanks to everyone who attended yesterday afternoon's round table on housing. I brought together a group of developers who have planning permission for almost 1,000 new homes in Broxtowe and planners from the Borough Council. Council Leader Richard Jackson and Councillor Tony Harper also took part. It was a robust and frank meeting - a number of problems were highlighted; we resolved some and I will be taking up a number of matters with the new Government. I am confident we will soon see the much needed development of the

Kimberley Brewery site and speed up the plans at Bartons in Beeston, where I have my constituency office.

Bramcote Hills Golf Course decision

I am very pleased that Broxtowe Borough Council's Planning Committee has rejected plans for a development on Bramcote Hills Golf Course. This is an important and much valued green open space and the Committee faced a difficult decision given the owners sought permission for a new care home with 60 bungalows and flats for the elderly. I am pleased that Bramcote's three Conservative Borough Councillors were tenacious in their opposition to the plans.



Toton Fly tipping - result

Earth banks and bridle gates are two measures that will help prevent further fly tipping at Toton Sidings and work to install them will begin shortly. The landowner has removed a huge amount of illegal waste dumped some months ago and discussions continue about how best to secure access at Bessell Lane.

My thanks to constituents who contacted me about fly tipping at the Sidings - I immediately contacted both Broxtowe Borough Council and the police. Please don't hesitate to report similar incidents to me wherever ever you live in the constituency.
