You may have heard today's announcement that the planned electrification of Midland Mainline has been paused because of problems with Network Rail's poor performance and the slow delivery of other projects. The Secretary of State for Transport, Patrick McLoughlin was clear that electrification of the line will happen, just not as quickly as hoped. Clearly this is disappointing news but I am pleased that Patrick was able to assure me and other MP's that the other improvements to the line will continue. This means that there will be more trains per hour from St. Pancras per hour and train times to Beeston and Nottingham will be reduced. It goes without saying that I will continue to press for the electrification of Midland Mainline.

I've had a number of important meetings in the last week and am looking forward to some excellent events this weekend. I hope to bump in to you at some if not all of them!

Defend our Green Belt - my message to Broxtowe Borough Council

I had a very positive meeting with the Chief Executive of Broxtowe Borough Council Ruth Hyde and the new Leader, Councillor Richard Jackson. We went through a number of key issues affecting the Borough, including the future of our Green Belt, HS2, the Beeston Business Park and Enterprise Zone and the regeneration of our town centres. I made it clear that I will continue to defend our Green Belt from housing development and I expect the Borough Council to take a robust view on seeking to amend the previous administrations Core Strategy or local plan which will allow thousands of houses on our Green Belt.

Kimberley Town Council in safe hands

Last week I met Kimberley Town Council and I'm pleased that the new members are standing by their pre-election pledges to oppose Green Belt development, to restore the Cemetery Chapel and preserve the War Memorial.

We also discussed the future of the town. I'm writing to Ikea to ask for assistance in sign posting shoppers to Kimberley; in the meantime Kimberley Town Council will help start up a strong, independent traders' association. I am of the firm view that Kimberley now has a transparent and democratic Council that will always put residents first.
