Supporting Shopmobility

Following a meeting with some of their excellent volunteers I am fully supporting Beeston's Shopmobility who need to move to better located premises.

The number of people coming into the town and hiring



mobility scooters has fallen from 200 a month to 30 in the last two years. The tram works have deterred able and disabled shoppers and things have been made worse for Shopmobility as they lost their premises in the Square and are now on Devonshire Avenue.

I have written to Broxtowe Borough Council and asked them to find alternative and more convenient premises as a matter of urgency. Given the adverse affect of the tram works on Beeston we must all work together to encourage people back into the town.

Fencing fiasco spreads to Bramcote!

Regular users of the A52 will know that the recent works have removed vegetation on the verge exposing neighbouring homes. I met a number of residents of Valmont Road and confess I hadn't appreciated the enormous loss of privacy until my visit. The road is at the top of a steep bank making it almost impossible for residents to restore their privacy.



I immediately rang the Chief Exec of the Highways Agency who undertook to take a fresh look at the problem. A simple fence is required - the benefits to residents would be enormous.

Meanwhile, some residents on Holkham Avenue have discovered they are not going to get fencing to screen their homes from the tram. This is a broken promise and this long running, ludicrous, fencing farce must be resolved by the tram constructors, NET and Broxtowe Borough Council. Residents need and deserve fencing and I will continue to fight their cause.



Working for you in Parliament

On Monday evening I joined colleagues from all parties to support the 1967 Abortion Act which was under threat from an amendment to the Serious Crime Bill. The arguments in favour of the amendment sounded superficially uncontroversial as it sought to ban terminations on the ground of the sex of the foetus. In fact that is already an offence and the amendment was in truth an attempt to undermine the 1967 Abortion Act.

We all agree it is appalling to terminate a pregnancy just because you don't want, typically, a baby girl. But the amendment would have had other consequences as explained in a very good article by my colleague Dr Sarah Woolaston. I voted for another amendment which was overwhelmingly passed, which sets up an enquiry into the prevalence of these types of unlawful abortions and how we can protect women and the foetus from unlawful terminations based on sex.
