Matthew met apprentices and heard of Bridgeway's outstanding work which includes training hundreds of workers in the railway industry.



There is a serious shortage of skilled railway workers which the Government is tackling starting with plans for a specialised college specifically to make sure we have a highly trained workforce to build and support HS2. As you might imagine Derby has already expressed interest. I will make local enquiries as to whether a case could be made for a College at Toton Sidings as part of any economic development of the site.
