Tram update

I am very pleased that TWA/NET opened Chilwell/High Road in Beeston last week to one way traffic.

There were stories in the media that NET has offered three months free travel to residents 'most affected by the tram works'. This has gone down rather like a lead balloon. Residents need and deserve compensation and only the City Council can agree to it. I am waiting to hear from the City Council leader about the financing of the tram. If there is any money left at the end because of the late completion it should be used to compensate those who have suffered hugely during the works.

Oxjam success

This year's Beeston Oxjam Takeover raised £12,800 making it the most successful in the Midlands and third biggest fund raiser in the UK. This is a huge achievement given Beeston's size and clearly the tram works did not deter people. The event is an annual happening and this year's 14 hour event included 14 stages across Beeston. Congratulations to everyone who organised the event and long may it run.

A52 works change

Having written to the Highways Agency about the planned works on the A52 they have replied that the work will be restricted to overnight lane closures between 8pm to 6am on Monday to Friday. To accommodate late night shopping in the run up to Christmas, the works will also be pushed back to a 10pm start during the next few weeks. My thanks to the Highways Agency for helping ease congestion during these difficult times.
