Attenborough Parking meeting

I had a very positive meeting about the serious parking problem in Attenborough. Midland Mainline, Network Rail, Cemex and Notts County Council have all agreed to work together to find a solution - and my thanks to them all for coming to the meeting.

Midland Mainline have agreed to do a survey of passengers using the station; the County Council agreed to look at parking restrictions; we will ask the British Transport police to work with the civil police to stop dangerous parking.

What we really need is a convenient car park for the station. Cemex have agreed to look at whether they may be able to help and I have already contacted the Blue Bell which has a 45 space car park just a short walk from the station. I will keep you updated on progress.
