Bus route news

Following my letter to Trent Barton about the No 18 they have confirmed there will be no changes to the route in the immediate future.

Notts County Council have also responded to constituents concerns about the Y36, which I have raised with them. They tell me they are considering "solutions to make sure that residents may have at the

very least an off peak service which will connect them to Beeston Town Centre to access local services or for onward travel to the City Centre.”

It's undoubtedly the case that the tram will have an affect on a number of bus routes. It's partly a case of "use it or lose it" but if re-elected as your MP you can be sure I will campaign to keep our excellent bus services as part of an integrated public transport system.
