Tram anger rises - Time for action

Despite good progress on High Road/Chilwell Road, there is growing anger at the failings of the responsible authorities to resolve a number of what I will call 'tram issues'.

Lower, Fletcher and Albert Road

I had another meeting with Alison Dobbs from Lower Road who has been campaigning tirelessly for her community



living (somehow surviving) in the heart of the tram works. Alison describes the area as "Alcatraz" with residents being "caged in" their homes for over a year. People are promised they will soon be set free! They had better be; one family has a daughter getting married at the end of May and they are determined she will be able to leave her home in the traditional manner.

Meanwhile, residents on all three roads are reporting serious cracks in the walls of their homes.



Fencing

This is a final plea to the leader of Broxtowe Borough Council to meet residents on the tram route who, quite reasonably want a 3 metre fence to restore their privacy. Milan Radulovic is a reasonable man and as such I ask him, again, to meet these equally reasonable, good people.



Save Our Shops (and businesses)

My thanks to everyone who has signed the petition calling on Notts County Council and others to compensate all small businesses affected by the tram works. Despite claiming to support my call, the County Council has thus far rejected two claims which I would have thought were clearly in need of payment. It all rather supports my view that Notts County Council were paying lip service to the extension of the scheme.

I have asked for an urgent meeting with the Leader of Notts County Council - I will assume the lack of response is because of some delay in the delivery of my letter to Councillor Rhodes.



In any event I will raise all matters with City Council leader, Jon Collins. We last met in February but for reasons I don't understand, he is not free to meet again, until June!

Meanwhile, congratulations to County Councillors Steve Carr (Lib Dem, Beeston) and Richard Jackson and Dr. John Doddy (Conservative, Chilwell and Toton) for working together on raising the issue of how the works are affecting residents and businesses at the next meeting of the County Council. Let's stop beating about the bush. Labour County and Borough Councillors continue to refuse to sign my petition when this clearly is not a party political matter given the Labour leader of the City Council supports compensation for all small businesses! It is about a group of Labour supporters playing party politics in Broxtowe for electoral advantage. This is best evidenced by the words of Beeston Rylands Borough Councillor, Steve Barber who wrote on his party's web site on April 14th

"County Councillor Kate Foale, Frank and I have been lobbying the County, City, contractors and NET hard to ensure that any surplus money from the Chilwell Road area is not simply lost into various balances but is used for Beeston, we are also looking for additional sums. I understand that a series of top-level meetings are arranged for the next couple of weeks. I'll keep you fully informed of progress."

You will note - there is not even the intention to work with Beeston's other County and Borough Councillors; it is also concerning that Beeston Central's Labour Councillors, Pat and Lynda Lally, who you might think would be at the heart of this "lobbying", are not.

Most importantly, it appears that we all agree! I hope Cllrs Barber, Prince and Foale will now sign the petition, invite Councillors Carr, Jackson, Doddy and myself to these "top level meetings", and work with us to do the best by our shops and businesses in danger of going bust because of the tram works.




Wollaton Probus
