Great exam results; do we need a grammar school?

Our schools have been celebrating a good set of GCSE and A'level results.

Alderman White achieved their best ever GCSE results. The Bramcote School had their most improved set of GCSE's and Kimberley School their best ever GCSE maths results. I am sure you will join me in congratulating all the pupils, staff, parents and carers for their hard work and efforts.

Today the Prime Minister gave her views on how we can make our schools better with seemingly radical plans to allow grammar schools to expand and to allow all secondary schools to become selective. Theresa May's proposals are not as simple as some of the headlines might suggest. They are worthy of full consideration and will be expanded on in a Green Paper. I am concerned

that some of the proposals appear to be a step backward. The Academy programme was achieving great success with more plans to help struggling schools. Broxtowe's four secondary schools include three Academys notably the Ofsted rated 'outstanding' George Spencer Academy.

I passed my 11 plus and went to the Henry Hartland Grammar School in Worksop which two years later became the Hartland Comprehensive. I've never been a particular fan of the 11 plus which labelled the majority of children "failures". I just want every child in Broxtowe to go to an excellent school whatever their abilities, for them to aspire to be the best, maximise their potential, be fit, healthy, kind and happy.

I may well be wrong but I don't think we need a grammar school in Broxtowe though I accept other parts of Nottinghamshire may well benefit from 'satellites' from other counties. It also has to be said that some parts of England, for example, Nottingham having been waiting a long time for their secondary schools to improve. However London's schools have hugely improved without the introduction of the 11 plus. I very much welcome your views please.

Smiths News - white van nuisance

For too long residents and businesses in Chilwell Meadows and users of Barton Lane leading to the Attenborough Nature Reserve, have had a large number of vans parked up on pavements. The responsibility lies with Smiths News whose Nottingham depot is on Brailsford Way just past the Village Hotel.

Despite complaints to Smiths News from residents and local Councillors the problem has persisted. Last Friday I became involved and immediately spoke to senior management. I explained the problem was their responsibility and gave them a week to make proper provision for their vans. The vans belong to "sub contractors" many of whom hire drivers.

Smiths News has made space available at their depot and dropped a somewhat disgraceful £20 a week parking charge. Please be assured I will continue to monitor the situation and my thanks to residents for keeping me updated. Smiths News working practises also concern me and I will keep you informed of my efforts to ensure workers are properly hired and paid.



Temple plans and Watnall generating site knocked back

Broxtowe Borough Council has agreed to work with the Hindhu Temple in Beeston Rylands after plans to install a 30 foot ornate yellow front were rejected. Whether it's a place of faith or worship, residence or business premises - it is important changes to any building are in character with the local area. I hope better plans can be agreed.

Broxtowe leader Councillor Richard Jackson informs me the Council has also rejected an application to build a huge electricity generating site on Green Belt land at Watnall.
